### Wattle Creek Winery

Wattle Creek Winery is best known for its lavish jewel-box tasting room located in San Francisco's historic Ghirardelli Square, where it provides unparalleled wine tasting experiences in the heart of the city. The original Alexander Valley estate was planted in 1971 and earned a reputation for excellence in Chardonnay and Cabernet Sauvignon. When it was later acquired by an Australian couple in 1989, Wattle Creek was renamed in honor of the "golden wattle" or acacia tree of their native home and began turning heads with styles more commonly found Down Under, such as Shiraz, Grenache and Viognier.



### DeLoach Vineyards

Experience firsthand the cool ocean breezes that make the Russian River Valley California's most prestigious source for Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. There is no better place to picnic in the vineyard than at this idyllic 20-acre estate, surrounded by the bounty of our BioDynamic gardens. Since 1975, DeLoach Vineyards has produced exceptional wines that spotlight the singular personality of Russian River Valley terroir and channel the Burgundian finesse which is the signature of the Boisset family of wineries.



### Buena Vista Winery

No trip to California's wine country is complete without a stop at Buena Vista Winery. Established in 1857 by the legendary Count of Buena Vista Agoston Haraszthy, it is California's first premium winery with a history as colorful as it is proud. A true Renaissance man who was ahead of his time, the Count is recognized to this day as the "Father of California Wine" for his epic journey to introduce fine wine grapes to the state, for building the continent's first gravity flow winery and for digging its first wine caves, all sparked by his early recognition of California's potential to become one of the world's top wine regions.



### Raymond Vineyards

One of the Napa Valley's most iconic wineries, Raymond Vineyards celebrated its first harvest in 1974 and traces its roots to the earliest foundations of this region's fine winegrowing revolution. Today, it ranks among the wine world's most dynamic destinations, dedicated to inspiring a passion for wine in an environment of creativity, elegance and luxury. Visitors will find delightful surprises around every corner that awaken curiosity and stimulate the senses, from the decadent Red Room to the Crystal Cellar including Napa Valley's first dog winery for your canine companion.
